

EVALUATION OF THE PRINCIPLES AND SAFEGUARDING REQUIREMENTS OF THE GOLD STANDARD FOR THE GLOBAL GOALS





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INTRODUCTION

This document prepared by Bustamante + Freyre (**B** + **F**) for the Luxun Energy Group contains a preliminary assessment of the Luxun Energy Group's compliance with the Safeguarding Principles and Requirements of the Gold Standard For The Global Goals (Gold Standard), dated October 2019, from the Gold Standard Foundation.

The Gold Standard are good practices or an international standard to accelerate global progress towards climate security and sustainable development. It provides the tools and guidance needed to deliver results on the ground in the most effective and equitable way.

They are derived from a number of international documents, including:

- The Social and Environmental Standards of the United Nations Development Program (UNDP).
- The Environmental, Social and Economic Sustainability Framework of ONU Environment.
- The Performance Standards on Environmental and Social Sustainability of the International Finance Corporation (IFC), of the World Bank.

For the preparation of this evaluation, the Topics Guide for Completing the Project Design Document (DDP) was applied, which contains an evaluation database of the Gold Standard Safeguarding Principles and Requirements for projects.

The Gold Standard principles evaluated were the following:

- Principle 1. Human Rights.
- Principle 2. Gender equality and women's rights.
- Principle 3. Community health, safety and working conditions.
- Principle 4. Cultural heritage, indigenous peoples, displacement and resettlement.
- Principle 5. Corruption.
- Principle 6. Economic impacts.
- Principle 7. Climate and energy.
- Principle 8. Water.
- Principle 9. Environment, ecology and land use.

The following data base evaluates through questions how the Luxun Energy Group complies with the Gold Standard Principles and Requirements, with three response options: yes, potentially or no. If the answer is yes, it is described as how it comply them, if the answer is no or potentially, risk mitigation measures are suggested.

- 1. The policies, programs and procedures that were seen were not signed by those who authorized them. In some cases they did not specify the date of approval either. In this sense, it would be accurate to consult the original versions of the following documents provided:
 - Human Rights Policy.
 - Protocol for Reception of Complaints and Reports.
 - Policy for the Prevention of Forced Labor and Child Labor Practices.
 - Grupo Luxun Employee Policy.
 - Integrity/ Anti-corruption policy/ programs.
 - Procedures for interaction with public officials.
 - Supplier evaluation procedure regarding corruption.
 - Policy for making payments to third parties.
 - Policies and procedures for contracting services and purchases Grupo Luxun.
 - Luxun Group Health and Safety Policy.
- 2. it is suggested to implement training and awareness actions on human rights for all personnel, including suppliers and subcontractors.
- 3. A Gender Equality Policy was not verified, it is suggested to implement a Gender Equality Policy, which comply with the national gender strategy, as well as awareness campaigns around this topic.
- 4. It is suggested to implement training and awareness actions on occupational health and safety issues.
- 5. It is suggested to modify the current employment agreement to:
 - Specifically recognize the right of workers to form trade union organizations and join them.
 - Describe the functions and tasks of the worker.
 - Explicitly stablishes the worker's right to voluntary resignation.
- 6. The implementation of a waste management plan is suggested.
